Dual Enrollment Participation

Approximately 300 students participate in Dual Enrollment across the school district.

Starting in the 2022-2023 school year, this rigor is reflected on the high school transcript as "General Dual Enrollment Course – No Credit" for the context of college admissions. Grades earned for Dual Enrollment students are GPA neutral. Students participating in Dual Enrollment may also apply for Dual Credit. Dual Credit is a component of Dual Enrollment where the grade earned is visible on both the college and high school transcript. Dual credit courses appear on the transcript as "YG" courses and they hold the weight of an AP course on the student's high school transcript.

DCPS Grading Policy

As of the 2021-22 school year, DCPS has revised the grading policy to address the needs of all students in a proactive way, recognizing that some grading practices employed during virtual instruction due to COVID-19 are no longer necessary.

DCPS grading policy revisions include:

- Final grades are published on student transcripts according to the traditional scale (A-F)
 - o Students may no longer elect to have "A", "B", "C", or "D" grades displayed on their transcript as passing grades of "P," but "P" may still be displayed for courses taken during the 2020-21 school year or during the second half of the 2019-2020 school year
- Incompletes and "I-complete" options are no longer offered.
